Intro to the person and why I made that decision

Ai Weiwei is Chinese artist and activist who produced a multifaceted array of creative work, including sculptural installations, architectural projects, photographs, and videos. While Ai's art was lauded internationally, the frequently provocative and subversive dimension of his art, as well as his political outspokenness, triggered various forms of repression from Chinese authorities. The reason why I selected to look at his SNAC record is because his works altered my interpretation of art making, and in some ways, also changed my perception of politics. I didn't really know about him when I was in China. I only know he was known for his work Sunflower Seeds. When I searched him on Chinese search engine - Baidu, the first result is the description of how he got arrested for his crime in 2011 and quotes from many negative publications. So I used to think of him as one nothing special old man but do all kinds of ridiculous actions to attract attention. Until I got a chance to watch *Never Sorry* - a documentary about him when I was studying in the US in 2017. And this documentary changed everything I know about him as an artist and as a person. I realized how brief he was to say "I love my country, but I wanna to push it to be a better place" and how intelligent he was to express his thoughts extremely accurately in his works. And he deserves to be known by more people for his contributions.

SNAC URL Reconciliation

There are currently two records for Ai Weiwei on SNAC. One record labeled "Ai, Weiwei" (SNAC ID: 59476473) and the other labeled "WEI WEI, AI." (SNAC ID: 1657149). Record "Ai, Weiwei" is a more complete documentation of Ai. Thus, it can be the main record. The resources under record "WEI WEI, AI" need to be merged to record "Ai, Weiwei".

Firstly, the primary SNAC entry is lacking the biographical information apart from basic information of Ai (birth day, nationality). The related links Virtual International Authority File, Wikidata, WorldCat Identities, LC/NACO do not provide sufficient biographical information. Secondly, there were limited resources about Ai under the main record. Also, each content of the current records is not viewable for the public. Finally, there are no related names under the main record.

Biography from trusted sources

Ai Weiwei was born in 1957 in Beijing. Shortly afterward, his father, the poet Ai Qing, was sent to a labor camp as an enemy of the revolution; the family lived in exile, mostly in the remote Xinjiang region, until 1976. Ai attended the Beijing Film Academy from 1978 through 1981, after which he relocated to the United States, settling in New York and briefly attending Parsons School of Design. In 1993 he returned to China, where he helped establish Beijing East Village, a community of experimental artists. Ai's practice, which encompasses architecture, Conceptual art, curating, installation, and photography, is driven by the artist's social activism and is often critical of the Chinese government.

Recourses




